Cash Payment for Hagerty Printing to Rise to \$.25: USE YOUR DRAGON CARD TO SAVE \$\$\$!

Drexel University Faculty Borrowing at Penn: Procedure at Penn to Change

Since 1973 a reciprocal borrowing agreement between the libraries of Drexel University and the University of Pennsylvania allows faculty and graduate students to borrow directly from each other's libraries. Since Drexel University faculty IDs have no expiration date, there is a problem with confirming the faculty member's current status. To solve this problem, Drexel and Penn's Access Services departments have revised the customary procedure: **Drexel Faculty will now need to bring a letter to the Van Pelt Library to verify their current status and good standing as a library user.** [More..](#)

New Library System Feature: Advance Courtesy Notices

When Hagerty Library books are due, an e-mail message is sent to the borrower's official Drexel e-mail address. That notice reminds the borrower to renew immediately or to return the books within a few days to

avoid fines. Several faculty members and students have asked for that notice to come earlier, but previously our library's system software didn't allow that. Now it does. **Hagerty patrons with books checked out will now get a Courtesy Notice five days before book(s) are due**, in addition to the customary messages sent on the due date, and those sent seven, fourteen, and twenty-one days after the due date. Ten new electronic resources are now available at Drexel University Libraries! The **AgeLine** database abstracts the literature of social

gerontology as well as aging-related research from the fields of psychology, sociology, social work, economics, public policy, and health sciences. **Art Index Retrospective** is a bibliographic database that brings together all the citations in volumes 1-32 of the print version of Art Index published between 1929-1984. **ASCE Conference Proceedings** provides access to complete American Society of Civil Engineers conference papers from 2003 to the present, with select papers published from 1998. **Book Review Index Online** is a comprehensive guide to book reviews that includes more than 5 million reviews from thousands of publications. **Communication Studies: A SAGE Full-text Collection** includes the full text of 16 journals published by SAGE and participating societies, encompassing over 5,000 articles. **CQ Weekly** offers full coverage of the U.S. Congress, including status of bills, votes and amendments, committee activity, and more. **Family Index Database** allows users to search for family related literature from sources in psychology, sociology, medicine, nursing, education, and religion in one convenient location. New Electronic Resources at Drexel Libraries



AgeLine is a free web service provided by American Association of Retired Persons (ARRP). It abstracts the literature of social gerontology as well as aging-related research from the fields of psychology, sociology, social work, economics, public policy, and health sciences. It covers aging-related issues for professionals in aging services, health, business, law, and mental health.

AgeLine also includes selected consumer content. AgeLine summarizes journal articles, books and chapters, research reports, dissertations, gray literature, and educational videos from many publishers and organizations, including AARP. AgeLine is updated bimonthly and includes links to full text wherever possible.

Art Index Retrospective is a bibliographic database that brings together all the citations in volumes 1-32 of the print version of Art Index published between 1929-1984. The database cites articles from periodicals published throughout the world, and includes English-language periodicals, yearbooks, and museum bulletins, as well as periodicals published in French, Italian, German, Spanish, and Dutch. In addition to articles, Art Index Retrospective indexes reproductions of works of art that appear in indexed periodicals. This database is also searchable in conjunction with other Wilson Web databases.

ASCE Conference Proceedings Online provides access to complete American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) conference papers from 2003 to the present, with select papers published from 1998. More than 5,400 papers are included with 2,000 to be added annually. Proceedings may be browsed by interest area, title, or year. Areas covered range from Aerospace to Urban Planning and Development.

Interpersonal Communication, Intercultural Communication, Cultural Studies, Discourse Studies, Television/Film Studies, Media Studies, Business Communication, Organizational/Management Communication, Written Communication, Rhetoric, and Literacy Studies.

CQ Weekly Online is produced by Congressional Quarterly, the largest news team on Capitol Hill, and offers full coverage of the U.S. Congress. Topics covered include: status of bills, votes and amendments, floor and committee activity, and backroom maneuvering. CQ Weekly Online includes an archive dating back to 1983, including detailed floor votes. Search by topic, page number, committee, "exact phrases or words," bill number, byline or reporter and by Boolean full-text and date searches.

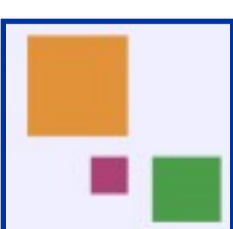
The **Family Index Database** allows users to search for family related literature from sources in psychology, sociology, medicine, nursing, education, and religion in one convenient location. Database coverage begins in 1995 and it indexes over 2,000 journals! It features many simple search options and also includes a search wizard for popular topics in the field.

PDQ (Physicians Data Query) is a database from the National Cancer Institute (NCI) that contains the latest information about cancer treatment, screening, prevention, genetics, supportive care, and complementary and alternative medicine, plus clinical trials. Cancer Information Summaries include clear descriptions of the latest cancer information reviewed and updated monthly by cancer experts. The database includes approximately 2,000 open/active and 13,000 closed clinical trials for cancer treatment, screening, prevention, genetics, and supportive care.
